#### Introduction

In today's rapidly changing world, marked by climate crises, political instability, economic fragility, mass displacement, and cultural fragmentation, the concept of **resilience** has gained renewed relevance. At Hekima University College, we interpret resilience not simply as the ability to withstand adversity but as a visionary framework for reawakening societies, building hope, and shaping transformative pathways toward justice and peace. This year's Research Week theme calls for theological, philosophical, and social science reflections that explore how communities, institutions, and individuals respond to interconnected global and local crises. We ask: How can faith, critical thinking, and civic imagination shape new governance models, redefine youth engagement, advance ecological justice, and support vulnerable populations such as migrants, the poor, and the marginalized?

In doing so, we aim to reimagine theology, peace studies and social theories by developing innovative, context-sensitive frameworks grounded in African experiences. We draw inspiration

from decolonial peace studies and theology, liberation ethics, post-conflict governance models, and youth-led civic movements. At its core, this gathering will serve as a platform for collective reflection, re-envisioning resilience as a transformative process that promotes ethical leadership, inclusive institutions, and sustainable peace.
